
Master Ndidong Sunday, gets his eye sight back

- Ndidong Sunday, a 15 years old boy lost his parents and is living with his grandmother in a remote village Eket, 210 Kms away from TCF Hospital, Calabar.
- When he was studying Junior Secondary School in 2016 he became blind due to bilateral traumatic cataract. The Vision was PL (perception of Light) in both eyes.
- Due to Blindness, he stopped going to school and moving around.
- His grandmother was a farmer and was difficult for her to manage him. She stopped going to farm and opened a small petty shop in front of her house so that she can earn and take care of her grandson.
- Upon reference by a known community member, his Grandmother brought Ndidong to TCF Eye Hospital, Calabar September 13, 2018. He was operated on his right eye on Sept 14, 2018.
- Post-surgery, he regained his vision and can read all alphabets in the vision chart.
- He is looking forward to start school again, play football with his friends because he loves football and his favourite player is *Lionel Messie*. ON 30TH REVIEW DAY.
- Now he is back to school and aspiring a bright future for himself and his family.



Story 2 – Mr. Jacob Omini who says "I AM HAPPY BECAUSE I AM SEEING WELL" and "NOW I CAN SEND MY SON BACK TO SCHOOL".

- Mr. Jacob Omini, 68 years old farmer from Ekori Village, Yakurr Local Government, Cross River State
- Due to blindness, he stopped going to farm from July 2017.
- The family depends on his earning from farming.
- His younger son stopped going to school to take care of Mr. Jacob.
- Mr. Jacob visited TCF Eye Hospital, Calabar along with his younger son. As a matter of fact, was brought by his son as he was blind. Upon investigations, he was advised to get a cataract surgery.
- He was operated on August 16, 2018.
- A day after surgery when his eye patch was removed, he could see very clearly. The visual acuity was 6/9.
- He was very happy and promised that he will send his son back to school.
